

Practicing NIH*-standard proposal writing for clinical, epidemiological, and health services/policy/economics research

Goals

- a. Introduce the required minimum standards for writing a proposal set by the NIH.
- b. Shape up the proposal ideas into a draft that can be further developed into a standard proposal

When Feb 20-22

Duration: 8 hours a day in three days

Participants: The participants are selected among teams of 3-5 people who have already developed a proposal idea. The application includes the submission of an application form and a one-pager description of the project. The one-pager project description should be outlined in a requested format. The proposal team should consist of at least three people, the Principal Investigator (PI), the co-investigator, and the methodologist (statistician/epidemiologist for instance). We will select only five teams to participate in the workshop.

The design of the workshop

After presenting the minimum standards of a typical NIH proposal, the instructor will ask the PI of each team to present the study with some slides. Each group has two hours to present the work in the requested format (see below). The Co-PI and the methodologist will help the PI with the presentation if needed but their primary task is to take notes. The instructor and other course participants will interactively provide comments to improve the proposals. The research groups will be mostly focusing on improving their work and re-presenting their proposal with incorporating the comments into the body of the proposal. All the research groups need to bring to the workshop is a power-point presentation of their primary idea written in a requested format (see below).

Instruction on how to submit the one-pager proposal idea

- Title (in one line)
- Specific Aims (50 words per goal, usually three Aims)
- Significance: Why your research project is important? You should prove your idea is essential for funding (100 words)
- Innovation: What are the new aspects of your project that have not been touched in previous studies (100 words)
- Approach: How do you want to perform the study? (50 words)
- Data: Explain your data [set] (50 words)
- Method: Specific statistical method for each of the aims (50 words per aim)
- Analysis: How do you want to analyze your data given your methodology under each Aim (50 words per Aim)
- Power: How did you calculate the power (20 words)
- Limitations: Briefly explain your limitations (30 words)
- Future work: Your plan to extend this study in the future (30 words)
- The minimum and maximum number of words: 700 and 1000 words.
- Margins of the page: 2 mm from all sides. Font: Calibri 10, Spacing: no space

Documents to submit: One-pager proposal idea + application form + CV of the research team
