PROGRAM SUMMARY

The Oregon Health & Science University Preventive Medicine Residency Program is a fully accredited training program for physicians in accordance with the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME). It provides two years of training in general public health and preventive medicine for physicians who have completed at least one year of ACGME-accredited clinical residency training.

The training involves both academic work toward the completion of the Master of Public Health (MPH) and practice-based training at a number of practicum sites based on availability and resident interests. Tuition for the MPH degree is fully covered by the program.

The program currently has seven funded positions: 2 are reserved for joint Family Medicine/Preventive Medicine trainees, 2 are housed in the Portland Veterans Affairs Hospital (VA), and 3 policy-focused residents are assigned to a division of the Oregon Health Authority (OHA).

The MPH and Practicum educational experiences at Oregon Health & Science University are combined in the two-year program. Residents who do not hold an MPH will have a choice to enter one of two MPH tracks*: the OHSU Epidemiology and Biostatistics track or the Portland State University (PSU) Health Management and Policy track. The OHSU track offers a curriculum rich in biostatistics and epidemiology with some exposure to health services organization and administration, environmental health, occupational medicine, and social and behavioral influences on health. The Health Management and Policy track offers a curriculum in health systems organization, environmental health, principles of health behavior, health care economics, strategic management, organizational theory and behavior, health policy, epidemiology, biostatistics, and values and ethics in health services. Residents with an MPH are encouraged to take electives that meet their specific practice and career interests.

What is Public Health and Preventive Medicine?

Public Health and Preventive Medicine deals with groups or populations, rather than individuals. Using population health knowledge and skills, the Public Health and Preventive Medicine specialist plays a role in the maintenance and improvement of the health and well-being of the community. This function is accomplished by evaluating the health needs of a population and developing, implementing and assessing programs that meet those needs. Recognition of specialty training in Public Health and Preventive Medicine by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC) began in the mid 1970's and specialty

Community Medicine Residency Program

The Community Medicine Residency Program is a five-year medical specialty program accredited by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. Physicians must apply to the program through the Canadian Residency Matching Service (www.carms.ca). The training program consists of a clinical component (minimum one clinical year with an option of a second clinical year in Family Medicine), academic coursework in community health sciences (possibly leading to a Master of Science or Master of Public Health Degree), and required and elective rotations in applied public health and community medicine. With this training, graduates of the residency program may choose from a variety of career options as Community Medicine Specialists, including working as a public health physician at the local, provincial, national or international level, providing community-based clinical services with a focus on prevention, planning and administration of health services, assessment and control of environmental and occupational health problems, and/or teaching and research in an academic setting.




Practicum

The practicum rotations are administered by the School of Public Health but involve field placement in a wide variety of settings. The practicum experience relies heavily on public health practitioners to facilitate appropriate field experiences. Residents also rotate through more clinically oriented venues, such as community health centers, Henry Ford Hospital and University of Michigan affiliated hospitals.

Each resident must fulfill thirteen months of practicum assignments. At least three months are required at each of the three "core" practicum rotations:

1. Governmental health department rotation—Michigan Department of Community Health, Washtenaw County Public Health, Oakland County Health Division, or Detroit Department of Health and Wellness Promotion
2. Community health center rotation—Center for Family Health, or Detroit Community Health Connection
3. Health system rotation—Henry Ford Health System, Allegiance Health, or Karmanos Cancer Institute

Four additional months must be elected at any of these "core" sites, at an elective site, such as Michigan Public Health Institute or at another site such as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the American College of Preventive Medicine, the Association of Teachers of Preventive Medicine or other federal sites agreed upon in consultation with the program director. Residents are strongly encouraged to apply for an elective rotation with the CDC, ACPM, or other organization approved by the

Program Overview

Successful completion of a residency in Public Health and General Preventive Medicine requires a minimum of three years of training:

- One year of an accredited postgraduate clinical year (PGY-1) in a primary care specialty within the United States or Canada (this Residency does not offer the PGY-1 training). Some applicants may have completed a full clinical residency.
- Two years of PGY-2 and PGY-3 specialty training in the Preventive Medicine Residency at the University of Michigan School of Public Health, which includes broad-based education followed by focused preventive medicine education.

The Residency's mission is accomplished through the provision of rigorous academic course work resulting in a Master of Public Health degree in one of the following departments:

- General Epidemiology
- Environmental Health Sciences
- Health Behavior and Health Education
- Health Management and Policy

Broad practicum experiences are offered with concentrations in applied epidemiology, public health practice, and clinical preventive medicine, which are typically provided in areas of high unmet health care needs.

Become part of the Public Health and Preventive Medicine Residency Program in Canada with an explicit focus on building skills to improve northern, rural and Aboriginal health and to practice the full breadth and depth of Public Health and Preventative Medicine. The Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada officially approved a change in the specialty from Community Medicine to Public Health and Preventive Medicine (PHPM). The new specialty and residency program title reflects the residency's primary training mandates centered on development of competencies in assessing and influencing the determinants of health.

The NOSM Public Health and Preventive Medicine program is designed with flexibility to ensure residents meet the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeon's training requirements while allowing tailored learning environments and areas of focus to meet residents' career goals.

The majority of NOSM residency rotations are scheduled within northern Ontario. There are opportunities to pursue placements in other accredited Public Health and Preventative Medicine residency program sites across Canada (e.g. in Montréal, Vancouver, Manitoba) as well as elective placements in a variety of settings within Canada and across the world.

Public Health and Preventive Medicine Residency Program

The Public Health and Preventive Medicine postgraduate program at the University of Ottawa is a RCPSC accredited 5-year residency program. We offer the opportunity for residents to receive comprehensive Public Health and Preventive Medicine training while living and working in a beautiful city.

Being located in the nation's capital, the program enjoys exceptional access to a variety of amazing training sites, including local and federal departments and agencies such as the Public Health Agency of Canada, Department of National Defence, Canadian Medical Association, Correctional Service of Canada, Health Canada, Direction de Santé Public de l'Outaouais, and Ottawa Public Health. These sites are a short drive, bike ride or sometimes even a walk away! Other public health units of Ottawa/Gatineau region are also within a reasonable commuting distance including Leeds, Grenville, and Lanark District Health Unit (Brockville). Ottawa Public Health, a large health unit with four public health physicians (one medical officer of health and three associate medical officers of health), provides an excellent training environment.

The program is flexible in offering a choice of two streams. Residents can pursue a pure public health stream, the advantage of which is a greater focus on public health (General Stream). Three final years of the program are devoted entirely to public health. The Family Medicine Stream offers the opportunity of obtaining Certification in The College of Family Physicians as a part of the program. The
